Year 3-6 are continuing their research into a fantastic playground in the school. So far we have researched shelters, ball runs, mini race tracks and features of the bike track. We used newspaper to make models of our shelter designs to see if they will work. The students have come up with lots of creative ideas already!

Writing

Year 3-6 have been working on story writing in English where they have used adjectives and adverbs to add detail to their writing. They have all written some great descriptive sentences. Here is Jacob's opening to his story:

News from the K-2 Classroom

In the K-2 class the last few weeks we have been extremely busy. In Writing we have been focusing on writing Procedures (making sure we include titles, materials needed and steps). One procedure we wrote and made was 'how to make fairy bread'. Parents can mention that recipes are similar to procedures. The Kindergarten students have been starting to write simple sentences making great attempts at unknown words.

In Maths we have continued to work on counting forwards and backwards to 200.We are improving our speed at recalling our addition to 20, while the Year 2 students are focusing on the counting pattern by 2's, 5's and 10's.
