Class 3-6 News

Students have commenced working with our new Whole School Spelling Program, Sound Waves. It is an expectation for the 3-6 students that they all will have their spelling words written in their homework books and will learn these words for a spelling test on Fridays. This week students will be given activities to complete as part of the spelling program to assist with learning the list words.

In Maths, we have commenced using i Maths, where students will complete an investigation following learning related topics to the investigation. All year levels are working on different investigations.

This program allows students to see the practical applications for their Math knowledge and develops their skills in being able to work mathematically.
